Missions Ministries Team Leader Guide



Thank you for your willingness to lead a short-term missionary team with Missions Ministries. Our mission is to transform lives and communities through short-term mission teams — meeting spiritual needs, providing medical care, building homes and community infrastructure, and expanding educational opportunities for children.

<u>The Team</u>

- No special skills needed
- Teams may range between 11-42 people
- Children ages 6 and older are welcome
- >25 consider dividing into 2 groups and building 2 houses for the best experience!

Note: All teams, regardless of size, will be charged a minimum for food and lodging for 11 people

<u>Costs</u>

\$14,500* COST OF A STANDARD HOUSE
(36X12 feet).
\$15,300* COST OF A SQUARE HOUSE WITH PORCH
(24X24 feet).
This includes all construction materials and construction staffing.

Team Center

- A safe, secure home base where teams eat, play and sleep
- Includes playground, basketball court, four-square court, pavilion, dining room, medical clinic and a ministry store
- All food, water, and ice served in the team center dining room are safe
- Surrounded by 10-foot walls with on-duty guards

23 comfortable rooms are available for team use.

Each room **sleeps 4**, **some sleep 5** and contains the following:

- 2 sets of bunk beds (some rooms have a bunk with a queen bed on the bottom)
- Private bath with shower
- Air conditioning and heat
- Towels, linens and blankets
- Alarm clock
- Dresser
- Soap and shampoo

Alcohol and illicit drug use is prohibited at any time during your mission trip.

* Teams will be charged food and lodging for any person who cancels less than 7 days before the trip

** The house construction costs are due 30 days prior to the trip.

***A \$500 deposit is due at the time dates are reserved.

Optional add-ons

Beds — Provide locally-made beds to the family Double — \$315 | Single — \$250 | Bunk bed — \$600 ****Mattresses included**

Interior paint — \$150/house — Note: Fills 1st afternoon, or simply leave paint with family.

Dresser — \$120—Provide locally-made dresser to the family

Cistern-\$240-A cistern is a plastic, sealable, 290 gal. water tank that families use to hold their water, which is delivered by truck

Curtains — \$80— Provide locally-made curtains for the house. Rods included

NEW Refrigerator - \$620 *NEW* Stove - \$270

Afternoon Outreach Options

Food outreach — \$350 — Provide approximately 100 people from the community a meal at a local church. This outreach is often combined with children's crafts and activities. Missions Ministries will provide the food

Prayer walk - \$36/interpreter - Get to know some of the specific needs of people in the community and join with them in prayer

Family visits — Returning teams may visit families that they have built for previously

Family dinners — \$10/guest — Returning teams may invite 1-3 families who they have built for previously to dinner at the team center

Soup kitchen—\$350—Provide a meal to the community served at a local soup kitchen. This outreach can be combined with crafts. Missions Ministries will provide the food

Point Zero— Visit a local residential community for adults with developmental disabilities. Teams can provide crafts and activities. A food outreach can be added (\$350).

Fundraising

The team will be responsible for funding all costs of the trip. All donation checks should be made payable to Missions Ministries. The team leader should collect all checks and cash donations, complete the deposit form, and mail to Missions Ministries.

Passports

International law requires that every team member must have a valid passport. Please check with the U.S. Department of State for up-to-date passport requirements. <u>www.travel.state.gov</u>

Mexican law requires that any non-Mexican citizen under the age of 18 entering or departing Mexico must carry notarized written permission from any parent or guardian not traveling with the child. This permission must include the name of the parent, the name of the child, the name of anyone traveling with the child, and the notarized signature(s) of the absent parent(s.) What to Pack

- Casual clothes for after jobsite
- Church clothes for service
- Work clothes for paint
- Sunscreen
- Cash for offering or store items
- PASSPORT

Note: Please be respectful in your choice of attire

<u>Tools</u>

Each person should have the following:

1 — Nail apron

1-2" or 3" paint brush

1 — 9" Paint roller cover

1 — Small trim pan and small trim brush

Note: Double paint supplies if painting interior

Hammers, paint roller frame, and pans to be provided by Missions Ministries

Leadership Roles

Devotional leader(s) — Prepare and lead morning devotions for team

Outreach leader(s) — Plans crafts and activities for any outreaches the team chooses

Water Captain - Loads water for each outing. Cooler and water provide

DRIVERS

- Meet at the Harvest Christian Center in El Paso, Texas **by 2:00 p.m.**
- Load belongings into Missions Ministries vehicles

- Mexico can charge 16% tax on any items that are not personal.
- Normally ranges from \$100 to \$500
- Missions Ministries will pay the tax at the border then reconcile with team finances after the trip
